At Lander Regional Hospital,

our goal is to deliver the best healthcare available in the Central Wyoming region, as we seek to make our community healthier. With the help of dedicated physicians, employees, volunteers and board members, along with your continued support and encouragement, we continue our passionate pursuit of excellence.

On May 1, 2014, Lander Regional Hospital and Riverton Hospital merged to form a single system called SageWest. The two facilities became SageWest - Lander and SageWest - Riverton. The two facilities will

continue provide a comprehensive array of inpatient, outpatient and emergency services. This merger will help both hospitals continue the goal of delivering quality healthcare close to home.



Although it is the single most important contribution both hospitals make to their communities, there are many other ways these two hospitals make a positive impact in Central Wyoming. Here are a few of the ways Lander Regional Hospital made a difference in 2013.

Nearly \$800,000 in capital improvements

In 2013, we added new orthopedic and diagnostic equipment to assist our physicians in caring for your health. And, in 2014, we will complete the addition of a new telemetry system.

In fact, we invested \$782,398 in our facility last year which, in addition to the above, included technology

replacement, information technology additions/updates, and important facility upkeep and maintenance.

Contributing to our local tax base

Last year, Lander Regional Hospital paid \$217,189 in taxes which helped support our city, county and state. This included state sales taxes as well as property taxes. These dollars help maintain local schools, fund the development of roads, recruit business and industry, and provide other similar services vital to support and sustain a thriving economy.

Helping those in need

Lander Regional Hospital is committed to ensuring the delivery of needed healthcare to all members of the community, regardless of ability to pay. Last year, the cost to Lander Regional Hospital was more than \$2.35 million to provide services for those without the ability to pay for their care.

Adding new physicians

During the past year, Lander Regional Hospital added five new physicians to our highly respected medical staff, including specialists in general surgery, family medicine, internal medicine, radiology and pediatrics.

With an annual payroll of \$15,452,882 and an average of 239 employees, Lander Regional Hospital is one of the largest employers in the region. This means that our staff and family members attend many of the same schools, shop at the same stores and volunteer their time and resources for the same organizations as you do.
